Information sharing is vital in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people. This has been a key factor identified in many serious case reviews. At Crabtree Farm, information sharing is embedded in our working practice and staff ensure that all concerns are shared with a DSL, primarily via My Concern (software for recording and managing safeguarding concerns), verbally and/or a concerns form.

All concerns are instantly shared via this software, with an immediate notification email to all DSL's. The DSL Co-ordinator will ensure that the concern is followed up promptly, to ensure that issues do not escalate, agree on the most appropriate action and to include a co-ordinated response.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and all children have a right to be safe from all forms of abuse and neglect. (What to do if you are worried a child is being Abused, March 2015).
